We appreciate the opportunity for Maine Conservation Voters and Maine Conservation Alliance to continue its First Light Learning Journey by participating in the 2024-2025 cohort. We're eager to keep learning about the Wabanaki present, past and future; the connection between the Wabanaki and Maine's conservation community; and how to expand Wabanaki access to and stewardship of land.

Organizationally and individually, we're committed to fully participating in the program and to working toward systemic change to enable this work of return.
